




CPD 2026: How to Teach the Better Bilingual 'New to English' Induction Programme (NIP)

Purpose:

Do you have 'New to English' pupils joining your school?

Perhaps they are refugee children or young people from Ukraine, Afghanistan, Syria or Hong Kong - or other international new arrivals?

Are you looking for an effective **6-8 week intervention programme** to be taught by your existing Teaching Assistants (TAs) or EAL Teacher/Lead to develop New to English pupils' **survival English** so they feel welcome and can access classroom activities as soon as possible?



This two-session, online training programme will introduce you to the Better Bilingual 'New to English' Induction Programme (primary/secondary versions) which covers a range of topics from 'About me' to 'The language of Maths'. The training will equip you with the **EAL strategies** needed to confidently teach this induction programme, which is designed to promote pupils' **initial English oracy**, value their **multilingualism** and complement **inclusive quality first teaching** in the classroom.

Intended Audience: Teaching Assistants (primary & secondary) with the capacity to teach 2-3 intervention sessions (20-30 minutes each) per week for the first 6-8 weeks of a new pupil's time in school. EAL Leads and other Middle/Senior Leads who are managing this work are also very welcome.
